## Upcoming nighttime light measurements on new floating bridge

Beginning at approximately 8:30 p.m. Tuesday May 3, and Wednesday May 4, WSDOT light experts will conduct tests and collect measurements on the lighting systems on the north side of the new SR 520 floating bridge. This work is expected to last up to five hours each night as crews take lighting measurements at various locations on the lake and on the new bicycle and pedestrian path. During this work, nearby residents can expect to see different light systems from the new bridge turn on and off for short periods of time. When measurements are complete, the lights will remain off until next steps can be determined.

This testing will help WSDOT engineers better understand how the lighting on the new bridge complies with contract requirements and environmental commitments. These measurements will also help us understand the concerns we have heard from project neighbors north of the new floating bridge. If additional nighttime measurements are necessary, we will notify project neighbors via email.
