

Northeast Points Drive and Bellevue Way detours

Revised dates due to wet weather

Culvert construction continues along Northeast Points Drive between 92nd Avenue Northeast and Lake Washington Boulevard/Bellevue Way. Weather-related delays have slowed the first phase of culvert construction east of 10210 NE Points Dr. as crews work to install a large fish-friendly culvert. Weather could continue to affect the schedule so watch our website for the latest updates.

The current road closure will remain through March 25, after which it will move west on NE Points Drive for drainage and roadway construction. Beginning March 26, neighborhood traffic along Northeast Points Drive will continue to use 92nd Avenue Northeast, but traffic for the Plaza Yarrow Bay office building at 10210 NE Points Dr. will again have access to and from Bellevue Way/Lake Washington Boulevard. This second phase of construction will be in place through March 31. A planned closure of Bellevue Way has been rescheduled for April 13-16.

New detour dates

March 12-25 culvert construction on Northeast Points Drive

- Northeast Point Drive is closed west of the Plaza Yarrow Bay Complex and east of 10210 NE Points Dr.
- Drivers should use 92nd Avenue Northeast to access Northeast Points Drive west of the closure area.

March 26-31 roadway construction on Northeast Points Drive

- Northeast Points Drive is closed east of 101st Way Northeast and west of 10210 NE Points Drive.
- Drivers should use 92nd Avenue Northeast to access Northeast Points Drive west of the closure area.

April 13-16 culvert construction on Bellevue Way Northeast

- Bellevue Way Northeast will be closed from 11 p.m. Friday night to 5 a.m. Monday morning over SR 520 for installation of a fish-friendly culvert. The on-ramps from Bellevue Way Northeast to westbound SR 520 will also be closed.
- Drivers should use Northup Way to 108th Avenue Northeast to 112th Avenue Northeast to get back to Bellevue Way Northeast south of the closure area. The westbound on-ramps to SR 520 will be detoured to the 108th Avenue Northeast westbound on-ramp.

Detours in place March 12-31




* Note: Only one location will be closed at a time on Northeast Points Drive. Pedestrian and bicycle access maintained at all times.

April to October roadway construction and tree removal

- Northeast Point Drive is closed west of 100th Lane Northeast and east of 96th Avenue Northeast from April through October.
- As part of this work all the remaining trees along the south side of Northeast Points Drive will be removed to make room for new retaining walls. Construction of retaining walls will begin when the tree removal is complete. Wall construction could last up to one year.
- Drivers should use Bellevue Way to access Northeast Points Drive east of 96th Avenue Northeast.
- Pedestrian and bicycle access will be maintained through closures at all times.

Construction noise

In addition to the traffic restrictions local residents should also expect the usual impacts of large-scale construction. Noise, dust and lights during work at night will be occasional inconveniences as the project goes forward, though most of the work along Northeast Points Drive will take place during regular daytime work hours.
