Medina to SR 202: Eastside Transit and HOV Project

New eastbound SR 520 off-ramp to Bellevue Way Northeast opens June 7

Construction crews will work day and night to complete and open the SR 520 eastbound off-ramp to Bellevue Way Northeast.

Details of the ramp opening:




- **When:** Friday, June 7 at 5 a.m.
- **Where:** SR 520 eastbound off-ramp to Bellevue Way Northeast

Details of the work before and following the ramp opening:

- **June 3-7:** Crews will install the stoplight at the top of the off-ramp over four consecutive nights
- **June 3:** Crews will pave the off-ramp
- **June 4-6:** Crews will install temporary barrier and signage
- **June 6:** 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. crews will close Bellevue Way Northeast from Northup Way to 103rd Avenue Northeast to tie the ramp into the mainline
- **June 6:** Crews will stripe the ramp and complete temporary barrier work
- **June 17:** Crews will begin excavating the old loop ramp during day-and-night shifts for several weeks until completed

What you can expect:

- Neighbors can expect nighttime noise from trucks and equipment including excavators, compactors and a backhoe.



This work is weather dependent and subject to delay.
